# week beginning 7 April

There are 17,269 unique people groups, and 7,188 considered unreached, which equates to 42% of the world population. We pray for:

- · Use of satellite and radio

- Advocacy and influencing helping individuals and churches to speak out re poverty and injustice; challenging unjust policies at every level.

### Our World

This week let's continue to pray for Ukraine, under constant bombardment from Russia.

- For the towns and cities most under fire
- For President Zelenskyy, and his family.
- For the church, for believers to stay focussed on Jesus, and to share their hope.
- For justice to prevail for the future of this nation
